Guidelines for Contributors

ISL is intended to address issues in the description and analysis of Slavic languages of general interest to linguists, regardless of theoretical orientation. Papers dealing with any aspect of synchronic or diachronic Slavic phonetics, phonology, morphology, syntax, semantics, or pragmatics will be considered, as long as they raise substantive problems of broad theoretical concern or propose significant descriptive generalizations. Comparative studies and formal analyses are especially encouraged. Submissions ranging from full-length articles to shorter remarks and replies will be considered, along with substantive reviews.

Manuscripts should be initially submitted to the general editorial address, jsl@indiana. edu, in .pdf and .doc(x) format. All submissions should be double-spaced throughout; copy should be anonymous and include a one-paragraph abstract. A computer file (preferably .doc) will be requested before publication; we ask that you use only Unicode fonts. A detailed style sheet appears at the end of vol. 23, no. 1; it is available electronically from our webpage or from any of the editors.
